Robert Clarence Christiansen died Dec. 28, 2008 at the age of 87
Robert was born on Aug 27, 1921.

Christiansen was a World War II veteran. He served in the military as a pilot 1942 – 1945, and worked for United Airlines for 33 years.

During a bombing raid over Northern Germany, his plane was hit, and he had to fly to Sweden, Skåne in order to hit neutral ground. He stayed in Sweden for the remaining of the war

He loved to travel, socialize at parties and work in his garden. He was the first volunteer for the Sonoma County Regional Parks. He opened the gate daily at Ragle Park for 17 years.

Christiansen was the son of Hans and Melia Christiansen, and brother of Aloyse Christiansen and leaves behind many friends.

Robert took care of his sister for years. She was a resident of San Francisco and Robert lived in Sebastopol.

He became a Danish Soldiers Club life Member on August 6, 1988. On March 8, 1994, he joined the Danish Society DANIA of California and Nevada as well.

Robert was a very pleasant, quiet, very likeable and a very friendly man. He is truly missed.

On January 5 1995, he established a trust and wrote a very generous donation of \$5000 to DSC. The money was not to be paid out before his sister had passed as well.

At this stage, via some exchange of paper work, the trust is now being completed and funds as prescribed are being distributed.
